


Most of all, we're thankful for the 6 infants and 5 mothers whom we have been privileged to serve over the past 6 weeks and the impact we are already having. The following story will explain what we mean.

Darci was referred to us by a local hospital, two days after delivering via C-section. Darci was homeless. She had no plan for how she was going to care for herself and her baby. On the night our team moved Darci and her baby into Maddie's Place, Darci told us that, but for Maddie's Place, she and her baby would have been on the street. Since coming to Maddie's Place, Darci's baby is successfully withdrawing from exposure to methamphetamine and nicotine in utero.



Since coming to Maddie's Place, Darci is doing well also. She is working on obtaining housing, is enrolled in intensive outpatient drug treatment, and is learning to provide care to her baby from our staff. Darci's story has now become part of our story at Maddie's Place.



CONTAGIOUS COMPASSION-OUR DREAMS

The dollars you give today will allow us to become the #1 Pediatric Transitional Care Facility in the country. That is our primary focus. But you should know that we also have dreams to expand our services to more infants and more moms in the Spokane area. Those dreams include completing the remodel of our current facility and adding 6 more infant care rooms to the 8 we already have. Those dreams include adding day care services for the fragile infants and moms to assist in their transition to new and more stable lives. Those dreams include looking at creative ways to assist our moms with housing, ancillary primary care medical services, and, more clinics like Maddie's Place. While the services for our infants will be reimbursed, our dreams to reach more babies and more moms, will require the continued financial support from our existing and future partners.
